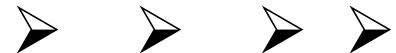

## ABOUT THE LEAGUE

The League is a nonpartisan organization that promotes informed participation of citizens in government and influences public policy through education and advocacy.

It takes action on public policy positions which are established by the members but does not support or oppose any political party or candidate. Non-board members, however, are encouraged to participate in political party activities although not as League representatives.

The League's structure parallels the three levels of government: local, state, and national. Local League members participate in the adoption of both state and national policies and programs.

The National Program includes such issues as campaign finance reform, gun control, international relations, natural resources, and election reform.

The State Program supports action on such issues as apportionment, education, gambling, land use, transportation, and others.

The Local Program involves such issues as educational funding, violence against women and children, threats to our water supply, and open space and farmlands.

To inform the electorate, the local League conducts candidates' meetings, publishes a voters' guide, and distributes voter registration forms prior to elections.
