a nonpartisan political organization that promotes informed participation in government and seeks to influence public policy through education and advocacy based on member consensus. The League does not support or oppose any political party or candidate.

The League is structured to parallel the three levels of government -- local, state and national. In addition to adopting programs for study and action concerning local governmental issues, local League members, through their delegates to state and national conventions, participate in setting League policies and determining state and national programs.

After studying a local, state or national governmental issue, the League seeks consensus of its members, adopts a position based on this consensus and then works to promote the position.

National and state priorities include campaign finance reform, civil liberties, election reform, lobbying reform and ethics, redistricting reform, voting rights, including for the District of Columbia, and clean air. Local priorities include health care and legislative reform.
